Crime & ASB

1. What's happening in Your Area

Criminal damage reports - Just one report of criminal damage to a property in Walkington which saw a cherry tree in the rear garden of the property being chopped down as well as wires to the satellite dish also cut. Enquiries are ongoing.

Burglary reports – Two reports last month, one of which involved unknown suspects prising open victim's garage by unknown means and stealing 2 x Honda bikes, along with other various tools before making off. Another property was entered by smashing the rear patio doors and once inside conduct an untidy search before making off.

Vehicle Crime – Just three to report last month one of which saw a vehicle attacked whilst parked up and secure within the grounds of a restaurant, rear window was smashed and golf clubs stolen from within. A quad bike was stolen from a cattle shed after unknown person enter farm and steal said bike. Enquiries are underway.

Theft – A locked pedal cycle was stolen from Saturday Market after suspect snapped the lock in order to steal it.

2. Ward Priorities for November 2021

ASB Flemingate area

To take positive action in relation to anti-social-behaviour within the area of Flemingate, working alongside council ASB team and early intervention to explore what measures can be taken in relation to ASB and offences. Along with increased foot patrols around the Flemingate site to deter ASB and reassure local businesses/residents. Give out crime prevention advice to businesses to encourage the reporting of issues involving this group so that offenders can be dealt with where possible.

Proactive patrolling

Proactive patrolling will continue around Tickton bridge, Molescroft Park and the Westwood. Group of youths are now gathering due to changes in the weather. We will encourage them to act respectfully and pick up their litter.

Humber Talking Feedback Action

Humber talking potentially to be conducted around the houses surrounding Flemingate after numerous logs over the last fortnight reporting gangs of youths kicking doors and causing damage on an evening. This will provide some reassurance to the community and also hopefully deter this continued behaviour.

- Increased traffic from cars and pedestrians that only stops for short periods.
- Activity or noise that is heavier at weekends, late at night or around paydays.
- People loitering around a property during periods of heavy traffic.
- People waiting in cars before or after visiting a property.
- People parking around the corner or a few streets away and approaching on foot.
- Money or parcels being exchanged through windows, letterboxes or under doors.
- Small packets being exchanged for money
- Debris including tin foil, small plastic bags, 'wraps', blister packs or syringes.

Operation Yellowfin

Op Yellowfin is a police operation to tackle the crime associated with motorbikes and off-road bikes. Front line officers continue to work alongside CID and our intelligence units to gather information about people we suspect of carrying out thefts and motorcycle related nuisance and crime.
