2. What's happening in Your Area

Vehicle crime – Six reports across St Marys last month, one of which was theft from a vehicle which was parked and secure in a hotel carpark, a screwdriver type instrument had been used to force the top of the rear nearside back door and in doing so the laminated glass peeled back and shattered. Once inside various personal belongings are stolen. The remaining two were damage related. A further twelve reports made across Minster and Woodmansey Ward during October, majority of which were damage related ranging from cars being deliberately scratched with keys or similar, to car tyres being targeted with nails causing them to deflate. At least two vehicles had damage caused to the paintwork of their car bonnets after a group of youths began hurling rocks from a communal carpark. Enquiries are ongoing. Finally a vehicle had their front number plate removed causing damage to the bumper in the process.

Burglary reports – Five reports across St Marys Ward last month one of which was to a shed removing 2 pedal cycles from within before making off. Another property had its garage broken into by means unknown and once inside steal a pedal cycle from within. Meanwhile there were three reports across Minster and Woodmansey Ward last month, two of which were to outbuildings stealing cycles from sheds and a petrol strimmer and cycle was stolen from a garage to another property.

Shop theft – A high number of shop thefts across both Wards last month, some of which enquiries are still ongoing.

Criminal damage – 4 reports made across St Marys Ward last month and a further several reports were made across Minster & Woodmansey Ward which saw a gate deliberately damaged to one property. Another property had their front door damaged by a group of youths throwing stones. At least two business premises were attacked, one was to a skylight after suspect climbed onto the roof and another had a number of windows smashed by unknown means.

Ward Priorities for November 2021

ASB Flemingate area

During November we will continue take positive action in relation to anti-social-behaviour within the area of Flemingate, working alongside council ASB team and early intervention to explore what measures can be taken in relation to ASB and offences. Along with increased foot patrols around Flemingate site to deter ASB and reassure local businesses/residents. Giving out crime prevention advice to businesses to encourage the reporting of issues involving this group so that offenders can be dealt with where possible.

Proactive patrolling

Proactive patrolling will continue around Tickton bridge, Molescroft park and the Westwood. Groups of youths are now gathering due to the changes in weather. We will encourage them to act respectfully and pick up their litter.

Humber Talking Feedback Action

Humber talking potentially to be conducted around the houses surrounding Flemingate after numerous logs over the last fortnight reporting gangs of youths kicking doors and causing damage on an evening. This will provide some reassurance to the community and also hopefully deter this continued behaviour.

Operation Yellowfin

Op Yellowfin is a police operation to tackle the crime associated with motorbikes and off-road bikes. Front line officers continue to work alongside CID and our intelligence units to gather information about people we suspect of carrying out thefts and motorcycle related nuisance and crime.



My Community Alert is a free web service which you can subscribe to and receive bespoke information from Humberside Police and our partner agencies.
