79. Election of a Chair

Resolved - Due to the absence of both Cllr Harold & Cllr Beal, Cllr Waddington nominated Cllr Julie Los to be chair at tonight's meeting. Cllr Richardson seconded. All agreed.

80. Apologies

Cllr Beal, Bowden, Harold, Jolley, Shores and Ward Cllr Mathieson

81. Declaration of Pecuniary and Non- Pecuniary Interest

Cllrs Hart, Jon Los, Julie Los, Swaby & Richardson all declared a pecuniary interest in the Woodmansey Village Neighbourhood Plan minuted below as item 86.

Code of Conduct Training - **Resolved** - Cllr Hart proposed that the clerk should also attend the East Riding Code of Conduct training. Cllr Oliver seconded. All agreed

82. Minutes of the meeting held on 17th July 2017

Resolved - The minutes of the meeting held on 17/7/17 were accepted and signed by the chair as a true record.

83. Matters Arising (Not otherwise on the Agenda)

- (a) Old School House - Due to the absence of Cllr Jolley this item has been deferred to the October meeting.
- (b) Clerks Appraisal- Due to the absence of Cllr Jolley, the outcome of the clerk's appraisal and the recommendations regarding salary increase and contracted hours has been deferred to the October meeting.

84. Road Safety

The council welcomed PS Beadman to the meeting. The main issue concerning the councillors is speeding on Hull Road. Monitoring has been done in the past and camera vans deployed, however, not during the main problem times ie after 10pm and before 8am. PS Beadman said he recommend monitoring strips at various spots along the road, for a couple of weeks to get a proper picture of driving behaviour.

Cllrs also thought that the speed on the Hull Rad should be constant, ie 30mph instead of having a short stretch at 40mph.

The chair opened up the meeting to allow the residents present to ask questions.

Residents also had concerns about speeding on the Hull Road and also complained about motorists not stopping to allow school children to cross by the school. PS Beadman requested that car registration details are reported to police, ideally by submitting a photograph of the car. Cllr Los asked if this request could be disseminated at the school, so that all parents were aware.

A couple of residents also complained about hypodermic needles being dumped in the bus shelter by King Street. The council ask the clerk to ask Debbie McGurn at East Riding Council whether there was a procedure for getting these cleaned up safely.

Another issue was raised regarding footpaths disappearing. Cllr Waddington will investigate to determine exactly where the problem are so these can be reported to East Riding Council.

A resident asked if bins for dog waste could be installed. Cllr Jump explained that any litter bin can be used for this purpose, and unfortunately that if there are lots of bins people still don't behave appropriately.

The chair re-opened the meeting.

85. Hedge Cutting at King Street

Resolved - A local resident has complained about the hedge at the King Street Park getting overgrown. Her property is adjacent to the hedge and last year her phone line was damaged when the hedge was given its annual trim. Cllr Oliver proposed that he goes and assess the hedge, meet with Christian Beal and get some prices for the next meeting.

86. Woodmansey Neighbourhood Development Plan

Cllr Oliver reported that following the Steering Group meeting of the 19th July 2017, the NDP document and schematic plan were to be updated to the final draft ahead further public consultation. The planning dept at ERYC have offered further assistance to finalise the documents. The few questions raised by AECOM, the SEA consultants, were to be answered. The Steering Group meeting did not go ahead on the 30th August as the chairman was unable to make contact with David Gluck, the NDP consultant, to confirm the tasks had been completed for group confirmation. This has led to delays over the summer. David Gluck has now made contact (on 18th Sept) to advise the outstanding actions are progressing. We are aiming to arrange next meeting on 11th October 2017.

91. Shop on Shopeth Way

The council acknowledged the concerns raised in the email from Mr Harper (all of which were included in the Council's comments submitted when the planning application for the shop was considered). However, they do not feel that there is anything more that they can do at this stage. It was suggested that if Mr Harper does experiences any problems with noise, anti-social behaviour, or cars causing an obstruction these should be reported to East Riding Council.

Cllr Swaby also reported that the new owners have been on site chatting with local residents.

92. Footpath by Scholefield Ave

The clerk reported that she has been in discussion with Sally Fraser, the pasture master's clerk. The matter is to be discussed on Thursday 21/9/17, so hopefully some more information will be available for the next meeting.

93. Bus Shelters

- (a) Shelter Opposite Wharton Arms - The clerk reported she has spoken to both Sheila Button (Highways) and Karen Abba (planning) about this and it would appear that the revised road layout and new cantilever style bus shelter will be implemented. It would also appear that even though we own the existing bus shelter there is little we can do to change this plan. The planning application for the Ivanhoe development has been approved. Cllr Oliver proposed he discussed a getting temporary repair done by C Beal. Cllr Swaby seconded. All agreed.
- (b) Adoption of Other Bus Shelters - The clerk has spoken with Debbie McGurn, who is waiting on confirmation of all the shelters being in good repair. Once she has this she will instigate the preparation of necessary legal documents.

94. Play Area

- (a) **Resolved** - The clerk reported that the repairs authorised at the last meeting have been completed.
- (b) **Resolved** - The clerk reported that the nettles at Southwood Park have been killed and cut back.
- (c) **Resolved** - The main issues highlighted in the August quarterly maintenance inspection concern fouling by dogs, birds and rabbits. These are cleaned up during the routine inspection but obviously this is an on-going battle. Clerk to seek advice regarding what are councillors responsibilities and can sign address.

In addition, at Southwood Park there are some holes in the 'BMX' area that need filling. Cllr Hart proposed that we ask Christian Beal to repair the holes. Cllr Richardson seconded. All agreed.

95. Request for a Skate Park

Resolved - The council does not own the park on Deer Park Way, so they asked the clerk to update Charlie Edmond, and pass on his request to East Riding Council, as they do own the park.

96. Request for an Allotment

Resolved - provision of allotments is being considered as part of the NDP plan. The NDP steering group would welcome input from any resident wanting an allotment. The council asked the clerk to pass on the link to the NDP website.

97. Emergency Plan

Resolved - Cllr Hart proposed the updated Emergency Plan is submitted to East Riding Council. Cllr Oliver seconded. All agreed.
